What does it mean to be part of the Canmore Museum's board of directors?

Holding a position as a board member for a non-profit society like the Canmore Museum comes with important responsibilities and commitments. It also has meaningful benefits for you and the community. This year, the board is looking to have 2 to 4 new people join us.

Time Commitment

Our membership appoints board members for a two-year term. The museum board meets once a month on the third Thursday evening at 7 p.m. There is an expectation for board members to attend most of these meetings, which are generally 1.5 to 2 hours in length. There are additional opportunities to participate on Standing or Operational committees and board members are encouraged to participate in museum programs and events that are of interest to them.

Being a part of a respected local non-profit organization's board of directors, such as the Canmore Museum, is a way to be of service to your community. This type of volunteer service teaches you valuable skills like leadership and consensus building as well as further building your connection to the community.
